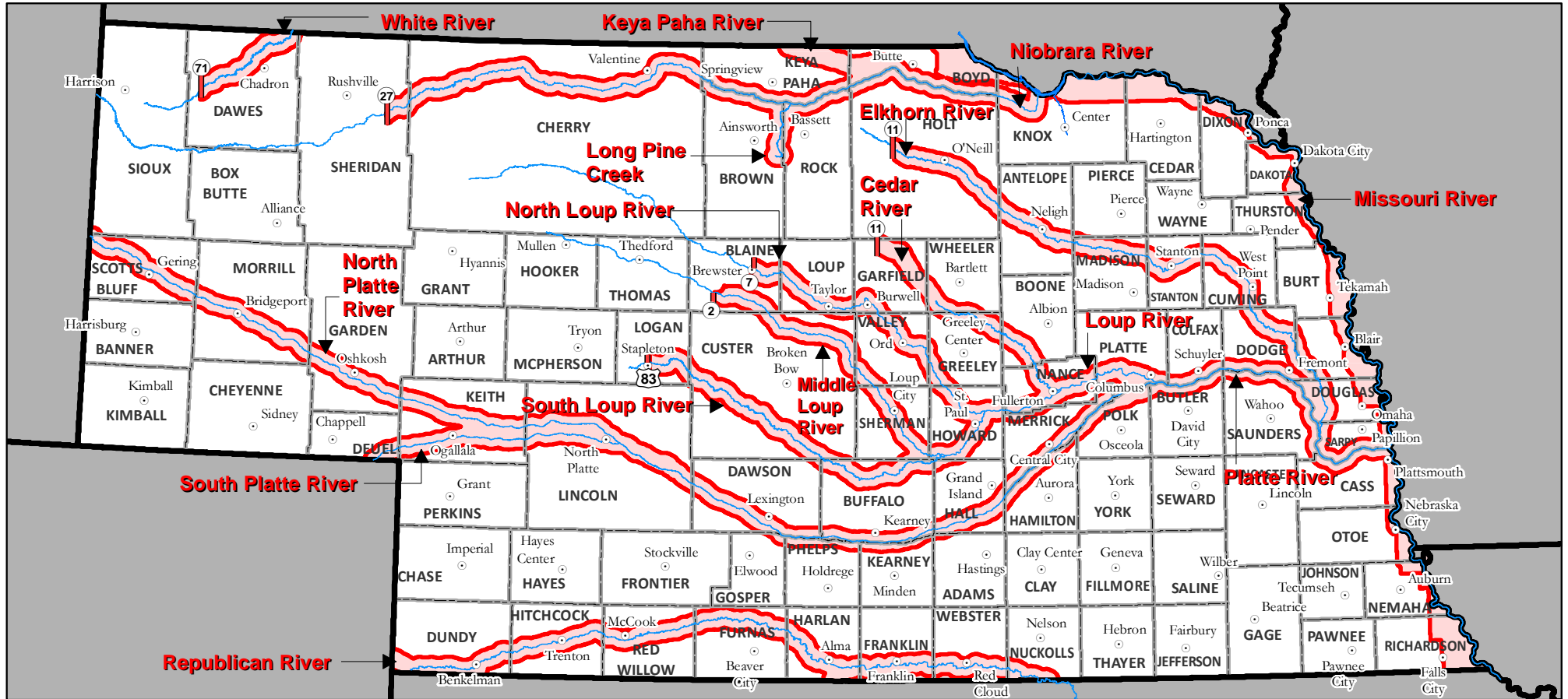


# 2016 Deer River Antlerless Unit



**MANAGEMENT UNIT DESCRIPTION** - That portion of Nebraska east of a boundary commencing with U.S. Hwy. 281 from the South Dakota border, then south on U.S. Hwy. 281 to Neb. Hwy. 12, then east on Neb. Hwy. 12 to U.S. Hwy. 20, then east on U.S. Hwy. 20 to U.S. Hwy. 75, then south on U.S. Hwy. 75 to Neb. Hwy. 133, then south on Neb. Hwy. 133 to U.S. Hwy. 6, then east on U.S. Hwy. 6 to Interstate 480, then south on Interstate 480 to U.S. Hwy. 75, then south on U.S. Hwy. 75 to Neb. Hwy. 67, then east and south on Neb. Hwy. 67 to U.S. Hwy. 136, then east on U.S. Hwy. 136 to Neb. Hwy. 67 to U.S. Hwy. 73, then east and south on U.S. Hwy. 73 to the Kansas border and within 3 miles of the landward banks of the following rivers: Platte, North Platte, South Platte, Republican, Loup, Keya Paha, South Loup from the mouth to U.S. Hwy. 83, Niobrara from mouth to Neb. Hwy. 27, Elkhorn from mouth to Neb. Hwy. 11, North Loup from mouth to Neb. Hwy. 7, Middle Loup from mouth to Neb. Hwy. 2, Cedar from mouth to Neb. Hwy. 11, White between intersection of White and Neb. Hwy. 71, northeast to Nebraska-South Dakota border, and Long Pine Creek from its mouth to 5 miles south of U.S. Hwy. 20.

**NOTES -**

- No hunting allowed on state and federal public land. State lands include state parks, state recreation areas, state historical parks and state wildlife management areas. Federal lands include U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Nebraska National Forest and National Wildlife Refuges.
- Season Dates: Sept. 1 - Jan. 15, 2017, Archery: Sept. 1 - Dec. 31, Firearm: Oct. 1 - 10, Nov. 12 - 20, Jan. 1 - 15, 2017 (archery equipment and muzzleloaders are legal weapons) Muzzleloader: Dec. 1 - 31
