



Official rules of the Nebraska Upland Slam

Hunters who harvest the four upland bird species that make up the Nebraska Upland Slam (bobwhite quail, greater prairie chicken, ring-necked pheasant and sharp-tailed grouse) are eligible to receive a special Nebraska Upland Slam award and be included in the online records of Nebraska Upland Slam winners.

Official rules

1. Program begins Sept. 1, 2018.
2. There is no time limit on completing a slam. It can be done in one week, one season or one lifetime. Any bird harvested prior to this date is not eligible.
3. All birds submitted for the Nebraska Upland Slam must be harvested in Nebraska.
4. Birds harvested prior to Sept. 1, 2018 are not eligible for inclusion toward a Nebraska Upland Slam.
5. A hunter can complete the Upland Slam more than once in a season.
6. Both Nebraska residents and non-residents may participate in the slam.
7. All participating hunters must have a valid, current Nebraska Small Game Hunt permit and Habitat Stamp at the time each bird is harvested and must follow all bag limits and any other regulations for the land upon which they are hunting.
8. Hunters do not need to pre-register to participate in the pursuing a Nebraska Upland Slam.
9. Upon the first harvest of a bird as a part of the slam (or as desired) a hunter will need to visit OutdoorNebraska.gov/UplandSlam and create an account with a unique User ID and password. This User ID and password will be used for all further entries in the Upland Slam.
10. In addition to accurate contact information and hunting license number, each submission of a harvested bird for an Upland Slam must include:
 - a. A valid e-mail address.
 - b. The date of harvest.
 - c. The county where the harvest took place. (For internal reference only.)
 - d. Whether the bird was harvested on public land or private land.
 - e. An uploaded photo of their harvested bird. (Once uploaded, these photos will become property of Nebraska Game and Parks (NGPC), and may be shared on social media or used to promote the Nebraska Upland Slam.)
11. As each subsequent new species is harvested, the hunter will log in to the Slam System and repeat the submission process. Agency staff will monitor all entries and may contact individuals as any questions arise.
12. Only one (1) bird of each upland species may be submitted and in the system as part of an upland slam at any given time.
13. Upon submission of a fourth and final upland bird species harvest, NGPC staff will check the records to verify submission of four species of upland game bird.
14. Hunters who do not have access to do online submission of their harvests will need to contact the Wildlife Division of Nebraska Game and Parks at 402-471-0641 for information on how to submit their entries.

15. Upon verification of achievement of a Nebraska Upland Slam by agency staff, the hunter will be provided with:
 - a. A certificate noting their achievement
 - b. A Nebraska Upland Slam pin
 - c. Their name entered in a drawing for prizes sponsored by Pheasants Forever/Quail Forever with all hunters who have achieved an Upland Slam during the preceding annual season.
 - d. The grand prize of a drawing for the shotgun will take place Feb. 9, 2019 at the Pheasants Forever State Habitat Meeting. The winner does not need to be present to win and will be notified.
 - e. Addition of their name to the list of Upland Slam achievers on the online Upland Slam page.
 - f. Winners' names and photos may be shared through Nebraska Game and Parks Social Media channels and other agency publications.
