Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Project: W-15-R Title of Job: 2022 Spring Wild Turkey Harvest



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The spring turkey hunter survey is conducted each year at the end of the spring season. The season closed on 31 May 2022. The objective of the survey is to obtain information on the spring turkey harvest and success. Information on age and sex composition of the harvest is also obtained and is reported elsewhere. This year's survey was available to hunters from 6 June 2022 until 21 June 2022. A full summary of hunter responses is provided in a separate report, *Spring 2022 Turkey Hunter Survey Report*.

Caveats. The spring Wild Turkey Hunter Survey samples spring turkey hunters who provided valid email addresses at the time they purchased their permit(s). As such, the sample frame may be biased and not strictly generalizable to the population of all spring turkey hunters. For the spring 2022 season, however, 77.6% of unique permits sold were associated with an email address. A reminder email was sent to all non-respondents one week after the initial invitation was sent, but no further attempts were made to contact hunters who failed to respond to the survey. Therefore, results might be biased toward successful hunters if successful hunters respond more readily to harvest surveys.

Interpretations. Permit sales for the spring 2022 season were 15.3% lower than the spring of 2021. Youth permits (4,132 permits) sales decreased 12.1% and regular statewide permit (27,141 permits) sales decreased 15.7% compared to spring 2021 (4,700 youth and 32,205 regular permits). Youth permits continue to be a strong component of overall spring permit sales, comprising 13.0% of the total permits sold for the spring 2022 season. Spring 2022 harvest was 20.6% lower than spring 2021 harvest (20,782), with an estimated total harvest of 16,498 turkeys in 2022. Overall harvest success was 52.8% for spring 2022, compared to 56.3% for spring 2021. Spring 2022 success rates were above the management goal for spring harvest success of 50%, but continue a pattern of decline.

Take-home Message. Spring turkey hunters continue to enjoy a high rate of success in Nebraska. The decrease observed in the number of permits sold and in total harvest can be attributed to both the return-to-normal many people feel as the concern for the ongoing pandemic wanes, and to decreases in the state's turkey population. For those spring hunters who went afield, success has continued to decrease while still remaining above 50%. Recent proposed changes to the season and permits structure may help bolster success rates in the future.

Methods. This year's survey was composed and administered in-house using Snap Survey development software (Snap v11) and Snap Webhosting service. An initial invitation to participate in the survey for the spring 2022 season was sent to 18,931 permit buyers (77.6% of unique permit buyers), but 817 were bounced back as undeliverable, giving an effective sample size of 18,114 permitted hunters. Initial invitations were emailed on 6 June 2022, and a reminder email was sent to all non-responding hunters on 13 June 2022. The survey was closed on 21 June 2022. The survey was also available on the NGPC website for hunters who did not have valid emails associated with their permits. The website survey was open over the same period as the invitation-only version. At the end of the survey period, responses had been received from 3,957 spring turkey hunters, representing 5,492 individual permits for the spring 2022 season. The raw response rate was, therefore, 21.8% and the permit response rate was 30.3%. Each survey respondent represented 6.16 unique spring 2022 permit buyers.




FIGURE 2. Spring turkey harvest, 1964-2022.




FIGURE 3. Spring turkey hunter success rate, 1964-2022. The horizontal line represents the success-rate goal (50% success) established in the Focus on the Future plan.

Results. Permit sales for the spring 2022 season (n = 31,273) were 15.3% lower than spring 2021 sales (n = 36,905; Figure 1). Although the COVID-19 pandemic was ongoing, no permit sale restrictions were instituted for the 2022 spring turkey season. Of permits sold, 4,132 (13.2%) were youth permits and 27,141 were statewide regular permits. Youth permits sales were 10.7% lower than in 2021 (n = 4,626), and statewide regular permit sales were 15.9% lower than in 2021 (n = 32,279). Of all unique permit buyers (n = 27,969), 77.2% bought only one permit, 17.5% bought two permits, and 5.3% bought three permits. Estimated total turkey harvest for the spring 2022 season was 16,498 turkeys. Of these, 1,717 were harvested on youth permits and 14,781 were harvested on regular statewide permits (Table 2, Figure 2). Overall, harvest was 20.6% lower during the spring 2022 season compared to spring 2021. Success during the spring 2022 season was 52.8%, with youth success lower at 41.6% and regular permit holders' success higher at 54.5% (Figure 3). Table 3 summarizes the 2022 spring season results.

FIGURE 1. Spring turkey permit sales, 1964-2022.
