

2022-23 Waterfowl Season Dates Preference Survey Results

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The fall of 2021 marked the first year of the restructured waterfowl zones in Nebraska. To clarify duck hunter preferences for the 2022-2023 waterfowl seasons now that hunters had a year in their "new" zones, Nebraska Game & Parks Commission (NGPC) conducted a survey of hunters that had registered for the Harvest Information Program (HIP) between 2018-2020. The sample frame was limited to one per household, for hunters that included an email address with their HIP profiles. The initial sample size was 29,879, but there were 1,806 bounced messages and 18 invalid addresses, leaving an effective sample of 28,055 waterfowl hunters. Hunters received an email invitation to participate in the survey on 13 December. Email invitees received one reminder emails on 20 December. The survey closed on 3 January 2022.

At the close of the survey, there were 2,630 responses, for a response rate of 9.4%. Respondents took on average 6.5 minutes to complete the survey. Respondent age, sex, and state of residency were seeded into the response database so that when a responding hunter completed the survey, this information was appended to their responses. To prevent "ballot stuffing," once a responding hunter completed the survey, their username became inactive and unusable.

Results

The tables and figures below summarize the responses received, broken down by residency (Nebraska/Not Nebraska). Among respondents, 2,010 (77.3%) were Nebraska residents, and 589 (22.7%) were non-residents. Respondents were representative of the sample population of HIP.

Because questions were voluntary, not all responding hunters completed every question. Sample sizes (n) provided in each table indicate how many respondents completed that particular question. For questions where multiple options could be selected, total responses will exceed the number of respondents who answered those questions.








