

Bridge to Birding

SPEAKING OF FOR THE BIRDS

Head outside and go on a bird walk. Look for as many birds you can find. Try to identify what birds you find. Record them on a piece of paper or journal.

Back in the classroom, list 10 threats these birds face on a daily and yearly basis. Think about their habitat in the summer, winter, and their migration (if they migrate). Think about what a bird has to overcome in order to survive.

Using a large sheet of paper, make a sign informing others to help conserve bird species by preventing a specific threat.

For example, your sign might say, "I belong indoors!" with a picture of a cat to remind people that cats are the number one killer of song birds.

Or, your sign could say, "Habitat Helper!" reminding people that birds need our help to prevent habitat destruction.

Or, well... you think of one!
