Phidippus audax


Size: L: 0.5 - 0.79 in. **Description:** Hairy jumping spider, black with white spots,

Shortgrass Prairie Region




The shortgrass prairie region includes the southwestern corner and Panhandle of Nebraska. This area is made up of short to mixed grass prairie and the Pine Ridge. The shortgrass prairie is the driest and warmest of the Great Plains grasslands.

This region receives an average of 12 - 17 inches of rainfall annually and consists of buffalo grass and blue grama. The Pine Ridge is found in northwestern Nebraska and is dominated by ponderosa pine. More than 300 species of migratory and resident birds can be found in the shortgrass prairie region, as well as a variety of mammals, plants, reptiles, insects and other species.

- Go to where the habitat is visit state parks and other public spaces.
- 2. Do your homework learn what species live in the area.
- Think about timing check what is active in the area this time of year.
- 4. Consult an expert join in on a guided insect hike to learn more.



Cercvonis pegala

Size: WS: 1.75 - 3.0 in. **Description:** Variable - brown wings, upper forewing has 2 large

yellow eyespots.

Diet: Rotting fruit, nectar **Habitat:** Open fields

Size: L: 1.4 - 1.7 in.

Description: Dragonfly with orange wings with brown bands and red spots on front edge of wing.

Size: L: 0.47 - 0.59 in.

Description: Iridescent greenblue head, red-orange body with white markings.

Vanessa cadui Size: WS: 2.0 - 2.87 in.

Description: Upperside orangebrown, upper forewing black with white, hind wing with row of black spots. Underside patterned

Isabella Tiger Moth Pvrrharctia isabella

Size: WS: 1.75 - 2.25 in.

Description: Forewings orangeyellow-tan with broken black spot, Female: has orange-pink hind wing Diet: Herbaceous plants (larva)

*Western Bumblebee

Bombus occidentalis **Size:** L: 0.4 - 0.9 in.

Description: Yellow and black bumblebee with distinct white tail.

Diet: Nectar and pollen

Habitat: Fields - agriculture and wild Viewing: Summer, Panhandle



Ten-lined June Beetle

Polyphylla decemlineata **Size:** L: 0.75 - 1.5 in.

Description: Brown body with vertical white stripes and clubbed antenna, larva can be agricultural pest.

Diet: Roots (larva), foliage (adult) **Habitat:** Associated with sandy soil and trees, especially apple

Viewing: Mid-late summer, west



Clouded Sulphur

Colias philodice

Size: WS: 1.5 - 2.75 in. **Description:** Male: Yellow-green

with dark edging on wings, white eyespot on underwing, Female: vellow-white, less bold edging.

Diet: Nectar Habitat: Open fields

Viewing: Summer, statewide



Familiar Bluet

Enallagma civile

Size: L: 1.3 - 1.7 in.

Description: Bright blue damselfly with slender abdomen.

Diet: Insects

Habitat: Near still or slow moving

water

Viewing: Summer-fall, statewide



*Brown-belted Bumblebee

Bombus griseocollis

Size: L: 0.37 - 0.75 in.

Description: Bumblebee with black head and wings and brown belt

band on thorax. Diet: Nectar and pollen

Habitat: Rural to urban Viewing: Spring-summer, statewide



Rainbow Scarab Beetle

Phanaeus vindex

Size: L: 0.29 - 0.5 in.

Description: Bulky oval beetle, metallic in appearance, copper, gold and green; male has horn.

Diet: Dung

Habitat: Grasslands

Viewing: Spring-fall, statewide
