The Nebraska Game and Parks Commission has responsibility for protecting state-listed endangered and threatened species under authority of the Nongame and Endangered Species Conservation Act (NESCA) (Neb. Rev. Stat. § 37-801 to 37-811). Pursuant to § 37-807 (3) of NESCA, all state agencies shall, in consultation with the Commission, ensure projects they authorize (i.e., issue a permit for), fund or carry out do not jeopardize the continued existence of state-listed endangered or threatened species or result in the destruction or modification of habitat of such species which is determined by the Commission to be critical.

Informal consultation pursuant to NESCA can be completed by using the Conservation and Environmental Review Tool (CERT). If a proposed project may affect state-listed species or designated critical habitat, further consultation with the Commission is required.
