

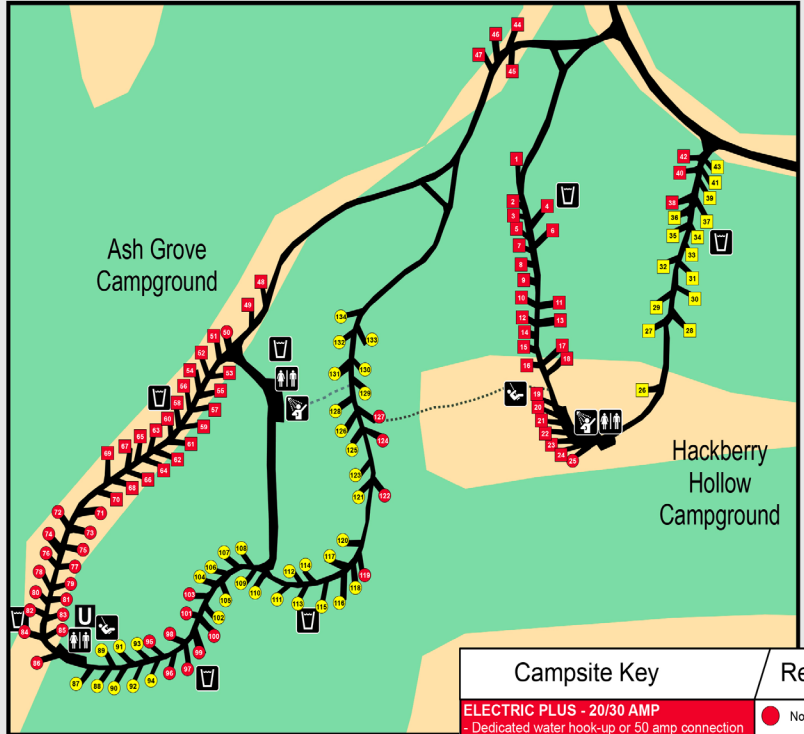

**ATTENTION, PARK VISITORS**

**FIREWOOD ALERT**  
A Voluntary Firewood Restriction and Voluntary Firewood Exchange are in effect to help prevent Emerald Ash Borers from spreading throughout Nebraska. Please do not bring firewood in from another state. If you have done so, **DO NOT** transport it to another location. Burn the firewood immediately or exchange it for local firewood at the park office.

If additional firewood is needed, you may:  
 - Purchase firewood at the park.  
 - Purchase firewood at vendors near the park.  
 - Gather firewood lying on the ground in the park.

Also, for your safety, there is an emergency notification system at the park. Alert sirens may sound for such situations as severe weather, flood, fire or a Cooper Nuclear Station emergency. If you hear sirens, tune to one of the Emergency Broadcast Stations or check with park personnel. EBS frequencies include: 1110 AM, 1230 AM, 101.3 FM or 103.1 FM. If it should be necessary to evacuate for any reason, park officials will direct traffic out of the area via NE 67 south to US 73 or via NE 62 west. Visitors are asked to cooperate by following all instructions from authorities.
