GET YOUR FISHING PERMIT

- Required for ages 16+
- Supports conservation and fish stocking
- Buy online or at local vendors



PICK YOUR FISHING SPOT

Nebraska offers countless lakes, rivers and reservoirs for every type of angler!

Family-Friendly: Louisville SRA, Fort Kearny SRA, Lake Minatare SRA

- Peace & Quiet: Schramm Park SRA, Sherman Reservoir, Box Butte Reservoir
- Rewarding Challenge: Fremont Lakes SRA, Victoria Springs SRA, Lake McConaughy SRA

CAST & REEL IN THE FUN!

- SPINCAST REEL: Hold button, cast, release button
- SPINNING REEL: Open bail, hold line, cast, release, close bail
 Remember: Practice makes perfect!

JOIN A COMMUNITY FISHING EVENT

Nebraska Game and Parks hosts events for beginners and families—perfect for learning and having fun.



GATHER YOUR GEAR

- **Rod & Reel** A simple spincast or spinning combo is great for beginners
- Tackle Hooks, bobbers, sinkers, extra fishing line
- Bait Worms, minnows, corn, artificial bait or lures
- Extras Sunscreen, water, snacks, pliers and a small tackle box



SET UP YOUR LINE

Step 1: Tie on a Hook or Lure – Use a simple clinch knot (NOTE: If tying on a lure, skip to step five).

Step 2: Add a Bobber (optional) – Helps keep bait at the right depth

Step 3: Attach a Weight – Adds casting distance and keeps bait submerged

Step 4: Bait Your Hook – Use worms, corn or artificial bait to attract fish



TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL TRIP

Fish early morning or evening for best bites

Be patient – sometimes the fish take their time

Switch baits or locations if you're not getting bites

Check Nebraska fishing reports for updates
